

BYLAW #4/99

RESORT VILLAGE OF SHIELDS

A Bylaw of the Resort Village of Shields in the Province of Saskatchewan to regulate the burning of refuse within the boundaries of the Resort Village of Shields.

The Council of the Resort Village of Shields in the Province of Saskatchewan, under the authority of the Saskatchewan **Clean Air Act**, Section 18, hereby enacts as follows:

- Definitions 1. All terms and expressions used in this bylaw shall have the same respective meanings as in Section 2 and 18 of the **Clean Air Act** and Section 11 of the **Clean Air Regulations**.
- Prohibition 2. No person shall cause or permit to be caused the open burning of rubbish, garden refuse, manure, animal carcasses, any material classified as a dangerous good, or any material which when burned, will generate black smoke or an offensive odour including insulation from electrical coring or equipment, asphalt roofing materials, hydrocarbons, plastics, rubber materials, creosoted wood, or any similar material in an open fire in a manner that causes air pollution within the boundaries of the Resort Village of Shields.
- Exclusions 3. Section 2 of the bylaw does not apply to:
- a) a camp fire or outdoor fireplace used for recreational purposes;
 - b) an outdoor fire using charcoal or cut, seasoned wood.
- when the fire is contained in a non-combustible receptacle constructed of cement, brick or sheet metal with a minimum 18-gauge thickness and covered with a heavy gauge metal screen with openings not exceeding .51 inches (13 millimeters). The size of the fire box of any receptacle must not exceed .8 cubic yards (.61 cubic meters).
4. Bylaw # 4/81 is hereby repealed.
5. This bylaw comes into force upon approval by Sask. Environment and Resource Management.
