Message from the Mayor

At long last – the sun and warmth, a reprieve from the unaccustomed amount of rainfall and cool. We have been told that we are to accept those things which we cannot change well, not without a battle or a word of profound distain!

As for the budget plans that Council put in place this past March . . . we may see near completion by . . . ? Well, let's work toward that!

The beginnings of our beach project are in place, albeit without the once planted tree that has fallen victim to perhaps, a careless action by someone being where they ought not to have been. Slowly, but surely, the realization of further recreational development in the area will happen as our Parks & Recreation Board will finalize plans and grant opportunities.

How about that golf course! it has never looked so good . . . a record number of golfers and seasons passes . . . great job!

Seven of the lots in the South Property development are now sold. Due to the extremely wet spring and summer, contractors have been delayed in their schedules; thus the wastewater system installation, potable water installation and roadway will be delayed until the Spring of 2011. As many have noticed, the Sales Office is set up on the property which has created a lot of attention and information distribution. A suggestion has come forward with regard to signage on #11 highway to indicate just where the Resort Village of Shields is . . . watch for the development of this very important image advertising effort that will assist in the community lot marketing profile.

Thanks to the excellent cooperation from Ken Klassen, Les Wintringham, Rene Adam and many volunteers, the advancement of the work required within the village has been achieved. Ken will soon assume the fulltime position as maintenance operations employee. Later this Fall there will be additional upgrades to the maintenance shed in order to provide better storage and service maintenance on village equipment.

As many are aware, there have been a lot of interruptions with our aging irrigation system. More 'preventative' maintenance will be happening this Fall in an attempt to minimize the line breaks experienced. The system will be shut down on Saturday, October 9 – please have your hydrant valves open after the shut down so that lines can be thoroughly evacuated with air pressure.

There is a need to have roadways kept clear for the ongoing grading work. The requirement is for a 24 foot clear passage way – unfortunately, if this is not maintained, bylaw enforcement personnel will issue tickets. Notification will be forthcoming to property owners with regard to unauthorized encroachments affecting our roadways. This is a necessity due to drainage and proper grading. Your cooperation with this request is sincerely appreciated in the interest of keeping our community safe.

Thanks to the 50+ Club for organizing an Octoberfest evening on October 2nd. These types of events give the community the opportunity to get together and celebrate the Spirit of Shields.

Water Meter Removal

It is that time of year again when our seasonal friends and neighbours leave for the winter. When you want and need your meter removed for winter storage please call Jessie at 492-2259 or our Village Maintenance man – Ken Klassen at 380-0266 to set up an appointment for meter removal. Please note that Ken will be working the following Saturdays October 2nd, 9th and 16th to make these removals easier for all involved. After these dates Ken will only be available during the week from Monday to Friday – 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

Seasonal Water (non-potable)

The Village will be turning off the SEASONAL water on Saturday October 9, 2010 at 12:00 p.m. (noon). If the weather turns colder it may be sooner. Once the water has been turned off, please if you can, make sure to leave your turnoff tap in the OPEN position so the water can BACK FLOW to the pump house and hopefully the water will not stay in the lines and we have less freeze ups next spring. (Be sure to turn them off again before the water is turned on next spring⁽³⁾) If you have any questions please call Dwayne at 492-2218.

Storage Spots

Please note we only have 6 – 8 spots remaining at the Boat House Lot area for people wishing to rent a storage spot for seasonal storage in a gated and locked area at a cost of \$100 annually. The only people with access to this area will be the owners of the boat house lots (no charge to them) and the people who are renting a spot for seasonal storage. All people who own or rent will be given a KEY for entrance to this area. For those renting - this is a storage spot for IN and OUT ITEMS ONLY. i.e. boats, trailers, fish huts - NO PERMANENT storage will be allowed for rental spots. The Village is not responsible for any stolen items and or damage to anything stored in this area. Please call Jessie at 492-2259 to arrange a spot if you are interested. All ITEMS (trailers, fish huts, boats) that do not have a rental spot MUST be REMOVED by OCTOBER 16, 2010. If you have any questions please call Dwayne at 492-2218.

Bylaw Enforcement Officer

The bylaw enforcement officer has been out and has handed out warnings and as soon as we can establish who can access license plate information from the RCMP, they will be back to handout out tickets where needed. Remember some of the issues that will receive tickets include:

- Parking on the roadway clearance requirements as previously advertised.
- Vehicles, trailers (licensed and unlicensed) parked on roadways in excess of 72 hours
- Angle or 'nose in' parking on streets bylaw is clear relating to "parallel parking only"
- Parking on the "wrong" side of the street.
- Parking in the middle of the road to obstruct the flow of traffic.
- Driving in Park Areas or Lake Front Areas with Quads or All Terrain Equipment

Permits Required for Chemicals by the Lake

Environment Protection & Management Act (EMPA) requires that a permit is required to apply any insecticides, herbicides and pesticides within 50 meters of the water's edge. The application form is available on line at the Government of Sask. Website – Ministry of Environment.

Please take your tree branches to the Dundurn refuse site. Do not put branches in the compost area as this is for leaves and grass only.
