Our regional infrastructure projects, the Dundurn Rural Water Utility and the Dundurn and Area Waste Water Utility are in the final stages of completion through the Building Canada Fund – Communities Component. The final wrap up for both is early 2013. The challenge before the representation on these utilities will be the ongoing operational efficiencies of delivering the respective services.

Council representatives from both urban municipalities and rural municipalities are being challenged for future planning within the region. In particular, we look toward health and eco sustainability of our lake as development continues. Roadway infrastructure, drainage of surface water, recreational aspects within the region and commercial aspects that may harmonize within the region are only a few intriguing concerns.

Thus, there are more than issues of dust, barking dogs, missing gravel, ground water, old poplars, grading roads, etc. that are important to us all. Our ability to deliver an economic level of services will always be our local governance emphasis.

Christmas Memory Tree 2012

The Dundurn Emergency Response Team, in conjunction with community partners is launching a new fund-raising campaign. All proceeds from this project will be directed to a reserve to be used toward building a new fire hall in the Town of Dundurn.



The Dundurn Emergency Response Team provides fire protection services and medical responses to the Town of Dundurn, the R.M. of Dundurn #314 and the Resort Villages of Thode and Shields. All members of this department serve as volunteers and some with more than 30 years' service.

The plan is to dedicate a pine tree located outside the Dundurn Community Hall as the CHRISTMAS MEMORY TREE 2012. From mid-November until January the tree will be lit with Christmas bulbs in memory of loved ones. A memory bulb may be purchased for \$20 for this season by contacting Glenn H. News from the Golf Committee

Your Golf Committee would like to thank all golfers for a great season at our golf course. We had a record number of season passes this year but would like to mention that next years rates will be increased as we want to continue to make improvements to make your play safer and more enjoyable. For those with a volunteer spirit we are tarping the greens on Sunday, Oct. 14 at 2:00 p.m. and could use your help.

Through the Dakota Dunes grant we were able to give golf lessons and free golf to over 40 kids this summer. We were also able to purchase 2 sets of good kids golf clubs. We have also arranged for new benches for the golf course that will be ready for the 2013 season. We are currently selling each bench for a \$150 donation to the golf course; each bench will have a plaque with the donors' name on it. Recycling

If the Village is to continue with the Recycling Program we need everyone's assistance. At present the recycling program makes a profit of \$1,000 - \$1,100 a year. Not a lot of money but it does represent our efforts at conservation and concern for the environment.

While the system works fairly well there is one problem: a few residents who do not, for whatever reasons, sort their material. The result is that various kinds of containers are dumped and have to be sorted. Of particular concern are the glass bottles that on occasion break, creating a mess to clean up, not to mention being a health risk. We cannot expect volunteers here in the Village or the staff at Sarcan to contend with this kind of problem, which, with very little effort, can be solved.

With this in mind here are some guidelines if you are delivering items to the recycle shed:

- 1. Sort your material and place the items in the designated container. Do not dump bags of various cans and bottles,
- 2. Remove all tops.
- 3. All milk cartons, plastic and cardboard, all tin cans, and all glass jars go in the Lorass bin.
- 4. Aluminum cans in the marked barrel
- 5. All other plastic beverage containers juice, water, tetra paks go into the big white bag.
- 6. Wine and liquor bottles go in the crates.

Within the next month there will be a new signage put up which will help mark the containers and make sorting easier. Finally, if it is too difficult to sort your material and place it in the containers then we would ask that you not deliver material to the recycling site. Put your material directly into the Lorass bin.

To the people who are sorting their material, crushing and folding it at times, and placing it where it belongs, a word of appreciation and thanks.
