Thus far in 2015 our community has grown......

- ✓ 25 development permits issued
- ✓ 10 building permits for a total of \$1,106,523
- ✓ We had 43 children under the age of 5 that participated in our first soccer lessons!
- As at September 2,006,840 gallons of water were distributed to 190 connections Ave. of 10,562 / connection or an average of 1,173 gallons per month/ connection

## **Fire Insurance Rider**

Reminder to all residents to ensure you have the proper coverage in case of a fire. The cost to call out the Fire Department is \$1,000 and \$1,000 for every hour at the site. This cost is charged to the homeowner so it is important to ensure that your insurance coverage has the appropriate rider to cover these Fire Department charges.

## **Storing Boat Docks and Lifts**

Please remember that when removing your docks & lifts from the lake you may not impede the area for foot traffic. In order to be stored on municipal reserve all docks & lifts must have the name of the owner on the dock or lift with a tag or visibly written on the item. A 30-foot walking access must be left along the lake. If possible docks should be stored on your own property. Any items that are blocking this area will be moved.

Please ensure that you park your boat trailers (with or without boats) on your own property. These items when left on municipal land – green spaces or road allowances can be subject to a fine.

### **Building Permits**

Building permits are required before any new construction, demolition or major renovation begins. The National Building Code is the standard. Building and Zoning Bylaws apply. The permit fee will triple if a project is started prior to a permit being obtained. Development Permits are required for most work done on your property. Contact Jessie if you are in doubt.

#### Pets

There have been a lot of complaints about animal feces in our parks & playgrounds. Pets are not allowed in our playgrounds & swim areas. If you walk your dog, please ensure that anything it leaves behind is picked up. There is a \$50 fine for the first offence.

## **Recycling Committee Update**

Please do not use the recycling centre (refundable items) as a drop off for odd things. Items that have been dropped off in the last few months have included: a television, an umbrella, vases, canning jars and books. This is not the intent of the beverage recycling centre.
