There are challenges in and around our community.

Over the past number of years the Resort Village of Shields has evolved to a community that supports a younger population with a desire to experience the fun surroundings of lake or cottage country. With this growth experience the needs and / or expectations of our communities is changing.

The challenges of governance and compliance with increasing regulation are daunting to those of us who attempt to navigate through the maze. All too often the volunteer members of your Council are requested to intervene with those who struggle with typical 'neighbor' issues from parking to dog ownership to noise and nuisance. While these issues are critical and often overwhelming, the leader group in the Village have additional issues to address from community service infrastructure as garbage collection, tree maintenance and renewal, access road works, recreation area creation and maintenance, regular street maintenance demands, equipment acquisitions and maintenance while also interacting with our neighbor municipalities in the region.

From this perspective our community requires the human resources to complete the daily and seasonal tasks that were done by caring volunteers in the past. We certainly appreciate the caring volunteers that make so many willing contributions toward the betterment of our community, however we have had to add to that 'work force' through the sharing of personnel and equipment between the Blackstrap Resort Village communities.

Rules and regulations, leading to bylaws are becoming an unfortunate reality in communities such as ours, mostly due to the disregard for property belonging to others, whether it is residential property, municipal property, or farming field property. Regulations or bylaws are an "enforcement tool" made necessary to attempt correction of this situation. Police or bylaw enforcement officers are in more demand than ever before; each of us has a role to play in this regard.

Your Council and Administrator are moving into final completion of our Budget in the next few days. The considerations for allocating our tax dollars are a challenge, however we will continue to make decisions in the interest of the greater community.

On behalf of Council and Administration we wish all an enjoyable and safe summer.

#### **2017 Property Tax Notices**

The 2017 property tax notices delivery will be delayed until after the assessment roll is closed and all appeals have been resolved. We anticipate that the tax notices will be sent out by the end of June.

#### Large Red Bins - Household Spring Clean Up

The red garbage bins will be here for the long week-end in May. It is very important that everyone abide by the restrictions of acceptable material that can be placed in the bins. Please remember that all whites (stoves & fridges) can be taken to Dundurn Landfill for a fee. Your own household garbage goes in your own garbage bin. <u>Construction material</u> of any kind is NOT ALLOWED in the red bins.

#### **Animal Control Bylaw**

Reminder to all residents that the Village has an Animal Control bylaw that prohibits pets from running at large and defecating on municipal lands and lands not owned by their owners. Please ensure to clean up after your pets.

## Shields Roadside Swap – Saturday May 20, 2017

Roadside Swaps help us find items to reuse that are in good condition, reduces our community's environmental footprint and keeps them out of landfills.

#### How it works

Starting at 9:00 a.m. on the swap date, items to give away are placed on the curb, making sure they're clearly marked as "FREE." After that, all swap items are up for grabs by neighbours and other area residents. The swap ends by 6:00 p.m. when it's time to return any unclaimed items back to your home along with all your newfound treasures. ### **Meeting with the RCMP**

On a quarterly basis one of your Council members meets with the RCMP to discuss current trends in the RMs, Towns and Villages. Currently there is nothing to report to our Citizens. Council Member Pasitney and the RCMP would like to send out a friendly reminder to everyone to keep your sheds, vehicles and homes/cottages locked when you are away from them. Remove the keys from your recreational vehicles (golf carts, quads, snowmobiles) when not in use. These small preventative measures will assist in deterring those with poor intentions.

Keep an eye out for each other, and have a great crime free summer.

### **Boat Docks and Lifts on the Shoreline**

It is a requirement that all docks and lifts stored on the shoreline for the winter months be tagged with owner name and contact number. Just a reminder to everyone as of May 31<sup>st</sup> all docks and lifts must be in the water or removed from the beach front/shore line area. This public reserve land is not to be used for storage in the summer, it is a privilege to be able to have our docks and lifts in the water so please everyone lets keep the beach area clean of debris.

Village management will perform a walk about of the shoreline to identify any material without identification that may be deemed abandoned and would be removed from the shoreline. If you know of any lifts or docks that have been abandoned please advise Council Member Dwayne Heidt so they can be dealt with. Thank you for your co-operation in keeping our shorelines clear of debris and help to maintain the beauty of our Village.
