Message from the Mayor....

Good Day Everyone..... in fact it has been a unique summer ... what is rain like?

Our community has had a growth spurt over the past month and we welcome all those new to our community. We also send our best to those that, for whatever reason, have moved on to new adventures.

We're moving forward, however thoughtfully, with creations and re-creations of facilities for recreation and service to our community. Considerations and evaluations are to some simple; however, prove to be more complex to the community as a diverse entity.

We remain concerned about bylaw enforcement - the role of Council is to provide bylaws that may be enforced by those who are charged with the responsibility. However, the enforcement of established bylaws is a task of a select group with the reality of a high cost. Thus, we continue to evaluate alternatives and to investigate possibilities of cooperation with other jurisdictions to enable our residents the security of our bylaw framework.

Those of us that reside or own property in this resort community realize that the former years of volunteerism have changed significantly. At our recent volunteer and "Spirit of Shields" award event, we heard stories and laughter about how things got done "back in the day"... from caring folks that hauled garbage, cut the grass, dragged a leveling bar over the roads... to current day "Standard Operating Procedures "for full time and part time employees. We are thankful to be able to share this new maintenance reality with our neighbors in the Resort Village of Thode. We welcome Kiaja Edwards, a Shields resident, to our maintenance staff to assist Fred Fehr with his ever increasing duties.

Our golf course has had another successful year. It is important to recognize the dedication of our golf committee and staff to deal with the course enhancements that have taken place this year. This has allowed very successful tournaments and course rentals to satisfied patrons and seasons pass holders.

There have been several meetings and negotiations with our local RM regarding the roads used to access our community. The reality of scarce federal and/or provincial grant funding, has delayed our plans, however other opportunities have come forward, mostly to do with the competitive nature of road building contractors. At our recent Council meeting we have approved funding to have an Engineering Group evaluate, design and cost the alternatives. The reality of an access road built to "Pavement Ready Status" has become a questionable alternative allowing us, however to request logical, fiscally responsible options that we will consider in the near weeks. We expect that once the engineering report is available and reviewed by Council, we will call a community assembly to hear the report recommendations and hopefully have costs of same.

We have experienced the fact that dust control was not available to us in the normal way that we contract the service. The former product was not available and the search for alternatives took a long time to find and then to research in terms of correct application and maintenance of the product application. Our operations manager suggests that we will have an alternate plan for 2018.

This dry year has placed significant pressure on our very old, seasonal irrigation system. The problem with this system is that it is aging, experiencing higher demand than ever before, and that it cannot take the increased pressure required to maintain the increased distribution demands. More importantly, we must re-design and install a more

reliable intake system as well as modernize our frequency drives that power the pumps. We continue to experience line breaks in various locations, which may be something we will always experience, however having a reliable contractor as we have, these occurrences may be minimized. Some thought has been given to doing a major air "blow out" of the water within the system prior to winter.

We trust that everyone will enjoy and travel safe this Fall ...

ATV / Golf Carts Bylaw

The Resort Village of Shields has enacted bylaws allowing residents with driver's licenses to operate ATVs and Golf Carts on our village streets. Unfortunately, there is a growing number of children who are too young to have a driver's license that have been observed driving these vehicles and sometimes not in a safe manner. If an accident should occur, it is possible that our bylaws may be in jeopardy. The RCMP has the power to disallow the use of these vehicles on village streets.

Remember this is a privilege – not a right. Please do not allow your children or grandchildren who do not have driver's licenses to operate ATVs or golf carts on municipal roads and green spaces.

Your cooperation is appreciated – nobody wants to have to trailer their golf cart to the course or worse yet have a child injured while operating a motorized vehicle. Lets keep our children safe!

Installation of Safety Fences on Shields Golf Course

This is to provide information on the installation of safety fences at Shields Golf Course happening this fall. The north south safety fence adjacent to Ladies' #8 Tee will have poles and hardware installed in 2017 and netting in Spring 2018. A deflector fence adjacent to Men's #8 Tee will be installed in Spring 2018.

The installation of safety fences is required to mitigate risks of errant golf balls for existing three residents along the west boundary of the golf course, for golfers and golf course staff. The cost of the safety fences is \$40,000. The funds to pay for the fencing will be taken from Golf Course Reserve (25%) and Off Site Fees Reserve (75%). Source of Golf Course Reserve is from profitable operation of the Golf Course. Source of Off Site Fees Reserve is from lot sales.

Council selected a solution considering, safety concerns of residents and golfers, risk of liability to the Village, financial considerations, input provided by Village residents, protection of golf course asset and future issues that may arise from more lot development. Fred Fehr, Operations Manager will work with contractors and oversee the project with an overall goal of full implementation prior to start of 2018 golf season.

Golf Committee

Our annual fundraiser tournament was held on August 12 with the maximum 80 golfers registered this year. We managed to raise \$4,700 with proceeds going towards running the golf course. The annual club championship tournament was held on September 9 and congratulations to Cory Dieno for winning the men's and to Linda Ellerington for winning the women's. A total of 45 golfers participated in this tournament. We are also planning on a third tournament for next year which would be a co-ed 2 person scramble which would be held early in the year and open to everyone.

We have laid new sod as well as created a turnaround on #9 T-box which has greatly improved this hole. New signs have also been put up on the #9 T-box (Freddies Lane) and on #2 cart path (Lindas Lane). Numerous projects are underway for the fall period including top dressing greens, building up green #2, and we are also looking at putting in a bridge going down #1 cart path. So far 2017 is shaping up to be a successful year both financially and with the nice weather for golfers as well. Linda has done an exceptional job this year considering the lack of rain with the greens looking as good as ever. Thank you to all the volunteers who keep coming out to our work B's, we could not do what we do without you.

Boat Docks and Lifts on the Shoreline

It is that time of year again to bring out the boats and lifts. It is a requirement that all docks and lifts stored on the shoreline for the winter months must be <u>tagged with owner name and contact number</u>.

Village management will perform a walk about of the shoreline in late fall to identify any material without identification that may be deemed abandoned and would be removed from the shoreline. If you know of any lifts or docks that have been abandoned please advise Fred Fehr, Operations Manager or Council Member Dwayne Heidt so they can be dealt with. Thank you for your co-operation in keeping our shorelines clear of debris and help to maintain the beauty of our Village.

A Note About Our Irrigation System

We are fortunate to have this system operating within our village so we do not have to use the potable system to water out trees, green spaces, gardens & golf course.

Please remember this water is not free, the cost of the water, line repair and pump house operation are a part of your tax contribution, so we appreciate your mindful use of the irrigation water – do not let taps run at length just because it is not metered at your residence. The irrigation water is metered and the village pays for the water and the power to pump it.

We have experienced irrigation system breaks this year resulting in shut downs. We understand these are annoying and an inconvenience for all. When the system must be shut down to repair a leak, please do not call our Operations Manager to ask when the water will be turned on. We work to get the system up and running as soon as possible. Timing for line locates and contractor availability plays a large roll in the duration of the shut down. You still have access to water – either from the potable system or the lake. If it will be off for a few days, an email notice is usually sent out.

We know there are still a few properties with the irrigation water plumbed into dwelling units. Please redirect your lines so that the irrigation water is only being used outside of your residence or cabin to protect our potable and irrigation systems.

Thank you for your patience when the water is shut down, your cooperation in conserving water and your attention to removing non potable lines from your dwelling.

An email notice will be sent out before the system is shut down this year for the winter months.

South Saskatchewan River Watershed Stewards

Watershed stewardship organizations across Saskatchewan work with local residents to protect ground and surface water.

Shields, working with South Saskatchewan River Watershed Stewards, will distribute a survey to residents in October/November timeframe. The purpose of the survey will be to gather information on holding tanks within the village. This information will be used to determine if a project to help fund inspection and/or replacement of this type of infrastructure should be established.
