Notice from Dundurn Fire Department

The Dundurn volunteer fire department will be implementing the following fee structure for false alarms:

1st false alarm - no charge (warning of subsequent charges)

2nd false alarm within 1 year - \$250

3rd false alarm within 1 year - \$500

Subsequent false alarms within 1 year - \$1000

If there are no further false alarms within 1 year of first call, fee will revert to no charge.

Parking Bylaw Enforcement Continues

Thank you to those that have complied with the Bylaw and have removed any vehicles/trailers from the public streets and alleys. However, the town office continues to get complaints about parking infractions. So just a reminder, staff will continue to place yellow tags on items that are contravening the traffic bylaw to ensure that the streets and alleys are clear for traffic, snow removal and emergency vehicles.

Garbage Collection - Loraas Disposal Price Increase

The annual agreement with Loraas Disposal has just been completed. Their recycling costs are rising, thus they have slightly increased their charges for garbage collection. Effective **January 1, 2019** the **monthly fee** for garbage collection will increase by .50 cents to **\$21.50**.

Animal Bylaw

Just a reminder to pet owners, dogs are to be on leash while in the Village and are not allowed on the Golf Course. The Village area includes the south end development right to the stop sign at the end of South Mawson, which is the entry into the Village from what is referred to as the '*turkey trail*'.

Congratulations to past Mayor of Shields

Harold Empey, a long, full-time and part-time resident and past Mayor of our Village was recently awarded one of the highest honours in the Country for his dedication to volunteerism for the past 60 Years. The Therese Casgrain Lifelong Achievement Award, which recognizes only one person in the country each year was presented to Harold in Ottawa on December 5th, 2018. Harold's contributions have included Melville city council, 10 years as Shields Mayor, Craik volunteer fire department, chair of the Dundurn Housing Authority and Rotary Club where he had the honour in many cases representing the World President of Rotary that has over a million members. Over the years Harold has assisted in fundraising millions of dollars for the University of Saskatchewan and Oliver Lodge just to name a few. Many in the Village may remember a fundraiser held at the town Hall where Harold was the auctioneer. The fundraiser was very successful due to Harold's knack of getting your money – a special loaf of artisan bread that was donated by one of the residents went for \$60.00! Harold's current passion is his 'Just in Case Binder' a program to educate and guide people through advance planning in preparation for end of life or emergency situations. Harold developed the program as a legacy to his late wife Betty.

As a recipient of the national award, Harold was also able to select a non-profit of his choice to receive a \$10,000 grant. He picked Oliver Lodge, a long-term care home in Saskatoon.
