Village Project Updates

Memorial Drive - South Extension

At the recent Annual Information meeting Council presented the summary of costs regarding the Memorial Drive South Extension. The project presented included the road build from Outlaws Ravine to the southern boundary of the resort village. The road has a design, which will aid in drainage and minimize snow removal issues. Clay will be hauled into place for the purpose of securing a good quality road cap with gravel integrated to the surface. Wood Engineering has designed the roadway and has prepared a document to which a tender has been established.

The approved 2019 budget for this roadway is \$144,000. Construction of the road will begin in early July. There will be road closures in place while the construction is in process, however signage and other safety measures will be communicated once equipment is brought into the village to begin construction. We trust that residents and visitors will stay clear of the construction site as the heavy equipment is operating.

Irrigation System Upgrade Project

The irrigation system in Shields is a very important and rare commodity that we are fortunate to have. As with anything, as time passes, infrastructure needs maintenance and replacement as it breaks down or wears out. Your Council and Maintenance Dept. have made a decision to upgrade this system to keep it working in good order for years to come. Last year a new pump was installed in the pump house. This year we have identified one set of lines that causes the Maintenance Dept. a lot of work with freezing and breaks. The line that runs through the alley of McMillan/McCrimmon will be replaced this year. As we do work to the system in phases, we will also be adding shut off valve boxes to segregate these areas. This will help keep the system running smoothly if we have a leak in a certain area as we will be able to just shut down that area to work on it while keeping the rest of the village pressurized. Councillor Pasitney is working with the Maintenance Dept. on this project. Feel free to contact him if you have any further questions on the future planning in this area.

The partial fire ban has been lifted in the Village of Shields.

Municipal Invoices

Tax notices were sent by email or regular mail at the end of April. If you have not received your notice, please contact the office.

Utility bills are issued quarterly. They are sent out by email or regular mail at the end of March, June, September and December. If you do not receive your utility bill in a timely manner, please contact the office.

There have been some issues with mail being returned. Returned mail is resent and if it does not come back, the expectation is that it has been received.

Boat Docks and Lifts on the Shoreline

As the deadline for moving lifts and docks off the shoreline has passed, Operations will be removing any remaining equipment left at the shoreline to the Maintenance shed for retrieval by owners. All equipment must be marked with owners name and contact information.

You Asked Us

Question: What do I do if someone is flying a drone over my property unsafely or intruding on my space and making me uncomfortable?

Answer: Contact the RCMP to report the incident, providing as much information as you can to them.

Question: Will Council consider a by-law to prohibit pot smoking in the Resort Village?

Answer: Council does not have the legislative authority to prohibit pot smoking in the Resort Village by enacting a bylaw. Federal and provincial Cannabis legislation provide the legal framework for cannabis. Under this legislation, a municipality can ban the sale of cannabis within their jurisdiction; it cannot ban the consumption of cannabis, the noncommercial production of cannabis (i.e. growing cannabis plants in a private home) or the delivery of cannabis within its jurisdiction.

Potable Water System

Lets keep our water safe

A review of household water usage indicates there may be some residents who are using the seasonal irrigation system for household use. If this is the case you are putting the municipal potable water system at risk of cross contamination. This could cause the Village to loose access to the lake water for irrigation purposes. It is prohibited to use non-potable water in any dwelling in Shields.

Follow good maintenance practices for your potable water lines. Periodically check along your potable water line on your property to ensure there are no problems, if you do repairs ensure you or your contractor do not introduce contaminates into your water lines, and if you are going to be away for an extended period have your property checked. If you are not going to use water in the winter it is not recommended to treat the lines with any chemicals to prevent freezing. This could introduce contaminates resulting a boil water advisor or worst case shut down of potable water system.

Save some Money, Help Operations Staff

It is very important that your curb stop is easy to locate and is <u>protected from the winter elements</u>. Please mark it to avoid a delay if your water needs to be shut off. There have been instances where an outside curbstop shut off was required to prevent flooding. **If your curbstop is not easily accessible charges apply for staff to locate it.**

Waste Water System

Preventing Problems in Waste Water Pipes

Recent work on the wastewater system identified we have a problem. People are flushing items down the toilet causing problems for our wastewater system.

What can't be flushed and why?

Put these items in your garbage even if they say they are flushable.

Paper towels, tampons, condoms, hair, wipes, floss

These items don't break down quickly enough in the wastewater system (or at all) and can end up clogging our wastewater system and your pipes. If you have a wastewater holding tank that you pump out, these products will settle in the bottom of your tank or be picked up by the waste hauler and pumped into the truck dump and then enter village wastewater system.

It costs the village money to de-clog pipes and pumping stations and in the worse case to replace damaged equipment.

What if the label says 'Flushable'?

Products that say they're flushable – like tampons and wipes – may make it down your toilet, but they might not make it through the sewer. There are currently no regulations to specify which products can be labeled "flushable". Cities around the world are developing standards to more accurately label whether or not products are truly flushable. For now, put them in the trash.

What can be flushed: Toilet paper, Poo, Pee

One more thing - Don't pour grease down the sink

This also contributes to clogging of pipes in your sewer or those of the village.

How do I dispose of the grease?

- Collect the grease in a container and put it in your garbage. Many oils and grease harden making disposal easier.
- When using deep fryers that use large quantities of oil, let the oil cool and pour back into the original container for disposal in your garbage.

Following these guidelines will prevent problems in the pipes, saving you money and preventing down time in the wastewater system.
