Mayor's Message

As we prepare this Spring edition of our newsletter it is windy and dry, an ominous start to 2019 with the need for fire bans in many areas of our province. Thus a word of care and caution, when travelling or considering a campfire or doing Spring clean up tasks.

The increased presence of RCMP patrols and/or visits to our community is welcomed as we continue to emphasize the bylaws with respect to traffic, fire works, and general respect for personal property. Please report directly to 310-RCMP for their assistance.

Over the past many months we have been working with our municipal partners to bring final agreement to our Waste Water Utility. From the Shields perspective, we have experienced higher maintenance costs due to the corrosive nature of wastewater from holding tanks and a stubborn frozen line issue all of which cause us to evaluate our reserves in order to adequately secure our systems. The freezing issue is due to traffic over an area with little snow cover, this will hopefully be rectified later this year.

Our 2019 budget process was successful. We are pleased to report that there is no mill rate or base tax increase this year, while being able to increase levels of service with highlights of dust control, irrigation system upgrades, and ongoing lake access upgrades. As conditions permit, the contractor will arrive in early May to apply dust control; please watch for notifications to have vehicles, etc. moved from the streets to provide clear access for this application.

The main road on our west boundary is now officially known as MEMORIAL DRIVE.

We will be upgrading the roadway from the ravine to the South Mawson entrance of the Village. Engineering plans are near completion, with the tender package going out soon. More information on this continuation of Memorial Drive project will be sent by special Council communiqué as we continue with this process.

This year we will be celebrating our 50TH ANNIVERSARY as a Blackstrap Village

To recognize this milestone: New Street Signs will be installed and on

July 6, 2019 we will have a "celebration event" please watch for upcoming details!

Our seasonal irrigation system has been under review . . . in the past we have upgraded pumps and controls. This year we will begin line improvements with the replacement of the lines in the back alley between McMillan and McCrimmon as this has been the source of problems for many years. There will be a disruption of access to this area while the equipment and workers are present, however the benefits will far out way the inconvenience of access for a few days. We will notify those affected directly. Included in the project is to locate isolation valves and "blow out" provisions while doing the work. Additionally, we expect to do discovery and repair work from the North side of the pump house to McCrimmon.

Based on our last water billings, the average water cost to 201 households is \$1.65 per day.

PARTIAL FIRE BAN IN PLACE IN THE VILLAGE OF SHIELDS

This year is starting off very dry and as many other municipalities have done, the Village currently has a Partial Fire Ban where fires are only allowed in approved fire pits with screens. No fireworks are allowed during this ban.

Lets keep our neighborhood safe by prudently managing our outdoor spaces and activities during this time of high risk for the potential of grassfires.
