Mayor's Message

SPRING IS HERE!!! This year more than ever we are ready for spring by putting the long cold winter behind us. Welcome back to any of the folks that have been south for the winter.

The 2021 Census is now available and indicates that Shields is in fact a growing community with the population rate increasing to 351 residents. This is a growth rate of 21.9% in the 5-year period from 2016 to 2021. Growth is expected to continue as new homes are coming up either as infills, or in SunTerra or South Mawson Subdivisions. We welcome all newcomers to our community.

Community Initiatives:

- The fibre optics project is just finishing up with many residents reporting positive results with their upgraded internet service and the ability to download and upload at a much faster speed. Along with any project comes the clean up, and we have noted the damage to some of the roadways caused by the installation of the fibre cable. Maintenance will be addressing this in collaboration with Redbird as soon as it is dry enough to do so.
- The village video has been published and is available for viewing on our website and on YouTube here. We are vey proud as we have had an overwhelming amount of positive feedback about our village as people watch the video. As we continue to market our community and provide more exposure, Shields may no longer be the best kept "secret". To assist with selling the South Mawson lots, the village will be using the professional real estate services of Philippe Chagnon and Sheri Willick, Coldwell Bankers.
- It has been a long wait, but we are finally going to get an all-weather road exiting the south side of the village. The construction of the connector road between south Memorial Drive and Highway 211 will begin this spring.
- Just in time for fall programming, Zak's building Group will be starting the construction of the sports court amenities building in May with completion planned for August 2022.

For more updates on Projects please attend the Annual General Meeting for the Village Date to be announced - More details to come.

There were 203 registered holes 123 pre-registered and 80 registering at the door. Prize money paid out totaled \$2,735.50. The event netted \$6,163.50 in profits to fund Sports court equipment and furnishings. Bravo everyone!!! This is the 3rd annual Fish Derby. The total for the 3 years is \$17,228.66 in net profit!! Amazing!! This fishing derby gives the village extra revenue for recreation projects, but also just as important is a great community builder.

Greenspaces

Spring is finally here in Shields! The Greenspaces Committee has some exciting things planned for 2022. There were some good initiatives completed last year with new planting around the village. This year we plan to do a more Maintenance / Upkeep approach.

We plan on working with Village Operations on upgrading the irrigation system for Songbird Lane. We will also be exploring the options of planting fruit & berry species to create a natural orchard for residents to pick over.

Outlaws Ravine needs some attention as well this year. There are 4 giant poplar trees that we would like to come down. They're posing a safety concern as they are dead / dying. There are also smaller trees in the ravine that will need to come down as well. We still plan on hosting another work bee to deal with all the deadfall on the ravine floor. This will likely be towards the fall, so watch for that communication if you're interested in volunteering for that initiative.


A Special Thank You


