The tender went out in May and was awarded to Brodsky construction. The road construction will be starting in September.


The fibre optics project is complete and providing a much faster internet speed. Unfortunately, with the installation of the fibre came some cost to the village with damage to our irrigation system. Some of this damage will be covered by the contractor but other breaks will be the villages cost as the irrigation liens were not always identifiable. Some of the other leaks experienced this year, are due to the aging infrastructure. Operations has done a fantastic job getting the system back up and running.

You have probably noticed that there is a beautiful new building in town. The new Sportscourt Amenities Building is up and almost complete on the outside. The large, covered deck on the building will be a great gathering space. The bathrooms will also be convenient for those playing on the sportscourt. The inside details are now being worked on and should be complete by the end of August. Just a note that this building was made possible through the Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program which covers 73.33% of the cost of the retrofit to this building. This space's programming will happen over the winter months.




#### **Online Registration**

#### Greenspaces

Our committee plans for 2022 will be to remove two of the four large dead Poplar trees that are a safety concern in Outlaws Ravine. Unfortunately, they are too large for our Operations staff to remove, so the use of a Contractor is necessary. When summer starts winding down, and temperatures start to drop we will be reaching out to the community for volunteers to help cleaning up deadfall and removing dead trees.

I want to thank the people who work behind the scenes that help to keep our Greenspaces and trees watered and healthy or give them the occasional grass trim. While we were waiting for our irrigation to come back online, I saw people watering trees, grass and shrubs with their city water or water tanks filled from the fill station. Thank you very much for your efforts!



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### **Operations Notices and New Additions:**

We would like to thank everyone for their patience while the staff dealt with the irrigation system this spring. Also thank the staff for all the repairs involved – Good job!

A few reminders for the summer:

- When operating ATV or Side-by sides, helmets are a must. Provincial law states that helmets safety glasses, and gloves are all required. Fines can and will be issued by RCMP and conservations offices. In addition, all motorized vehicles must be driven by someone with a valid operators license.
- Please remember all homes should have a house number on them, and if you have regular access to your house from the rear, we suggest numbers on both sides. It is important to consider that if you make an emergency call or call 911, the responders will need to locate your property in a timely manner.
- Please remember the speed on memorial drive is 30km/hr and the interior of the village is 20km/hr. This is for the safety of all, and there are many families with younger children.
- Please do not flush baby wipes, shop towels, disinfecting wipes, or feminine products as they are very harmful to our system.
