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# **Golf Committee**



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# Operations, Maintenance and Other Information:

#### Docks

As fall is upon us and most of the docks & lifts are now out of the water, just a reminder to make sure to leave enough room for residents to walk along the shoreline.

Over the summer, Fred Fehr and councilor Garry Hovland have created new dock spaces for the residents who do not yet have a spot for their equipment. The Village hopes to have new spots available next year.

### Shields Seasonal Storage Site

The seasonal storage lot policy has been updated this year, and is posted on the website. The storage fees have not been increased in a very long time, so Council made the decision this year to increase fees to \$250/year. Council believes this is still a fair and reasonable price compared to other storage options in the surrounding area. As always we ask residents who use the storage site to keep their equipment and materials in tidy condition.

#### Maintenance

A huge THANK YOU to our maintenance staff, operations manager Fred, staff Glenn, seasonal staff Ken and summer student Aiden also Kohl and Morgan on the golf course. Another thanks to Becky for filling in while Jessica was off on maternity leave and Mackenzie for helping out in the office. The village looks great considering the extremely dry summer we had.

- Please remember all vehicles, trailers, boats etc. have to be removed from roadways before November 1st to ease in winter snow removal.
- Smoke/carbon monoxide detectors should be tested once a year. If battery operated batteries should be replaced. Whether hard wired or battery operated detectors should be replaced every 10 years.
- Please number your houses it makes it much easier for emergency vehicles to find your home if necessary.
- Irrigation water has been turned off, please open your taps so everything can drain back. Thanks.

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#### Update from the EMO Planning Committee:

We are pleased to welcome Tim Black from the Village as our new Block Captain Co-ordinator replacing Garry Hovland. Tim is currently the Senior Health and Safety Advisor with Federated Co-op and will bring much of his expertise with business continuity to our team. Garry Hovland will remain on the EMO Planning Committee as the EMO council representative and will continue to provide his expertise and help to transition his role of Block Captain Co-ordinator to Tim.

Our annual Block Captain 'Emergency Test' is being held this Tuesday, October 17th at the Community Hall for the 17 Block Captains and the 4 members of the Planning Committee. Each year we look at a different emergency situation to run through the various roles and responsibilities of the members. This year the country and the world has seen a number of out of control grass fires and we felt it was a good opportunity for the team to run through this type of emergency. These annual exercises have been beneficial to the group and helps everyone to know what they may expect and provides a great opportunity for discussion to improve or enhance Shields Emergency Plan where needed. # **Slick Text Subscription Information**

If you want to receive notices and updates on Shields operational services (irrigation notices, or road closures) via text, please sign up by following the instructions below.

To subscribe and receive Shields Operational Notices, follow these 3 easy steps:

- 1. Create a new text message to 844-657-8610 (do not include a 1)
- 2. Text the word shields (nothing else)
- 3. Shortly you will receive a response text to confirm subscription, follow the instructions and reply YES

You will then receive a confirmation text, and no further action is required. You are now ready to receive text notices from the Village of Shields. To unsubscribe at any time: Text the word STOP

This service works similar to text messaging used by other organizations such as the RCMP Saskatchewan Crime Watch and many retail businesses. Once you sign up for the service, you can opt out at any time. Shields will continue to use existing forms of communication including email, this is simply another communication tool for quick operational updates on immediate operational issues or activities in the Village.



Note: The texting service only recognizes the words: shields, Yes, Stop and Help.

The messaging is a one-way communication from the Village to residents and does not allow for two-way communication. Do not send any messages to this number other than what has been described.

Suggestion: To easily identify incoming texts from the Village, add a new contact called 'Shields Text Notices' with the unique number of 844-657-8610.

This number is not a phone number and is only used as the texting number for this service. Do not phone this number – no one is at the other end!
