

Jenson Stromberg Chartered Professional Accountants have completed the village's year-end audit. The audit reported that the village is in good standing. With the lot sale from last year and the grants received, along with the accounts that were underspent in

some areas, the village shows a surplus at year end. This is after paying for the village's share of the new connector road to 211. Well done team!!

The following were some of the larger village projects completed in 2023:

- Road construction of the connector road to Highway 211.
- Asphalt and furnishings for the HUB/Sport Court.
- Upgrades to the lift stations.
- Upgrades and renovations to the hall including the bathroom upgrades and full interior, wall repair and painting.
- A village sign at the entrance to the village off the new connector road.
- Golf Course completion of moving hole 6 and upgrading hole 2 tee off box.

Council has approved the 2024 operating budget and great news that with careful planning we were able to balance the budget without raising the base tax or the mill rate for the second consecutive year.For more details on the village finances, past and future plans, we invite you to attend the Village informational meeting planned for May, date to be announced soon.

This year Shields is holding a Community Canada Day Celebration. The committee has members from Shields, RM of Dundurn, Town of Dundurn, PSP Dundurn and assistance from the Blackstrap Provincial Park. Classes will run two days per week. Tuesdays and Thursday mornings @ 10:00 a.m. starting Tuesday, May 7th.


Charge will be a minimal fee of \$2.00 per session.

Any person who wishes to appeal their assessment should directly contact the Board of Revision Secretary, Kristen Tokaryk, Box 149, Meota, SK S0M 1X0, by the 5th day of May 2024. An appeal fee of \$50 is required to be remitted with the appeal. Successful appeals will have the fee refunded.

- Red Loraas Bins will be brought to the village on May long weekend for residents to dispose of larger waste items

# Operations, Maintenance and Other Information:

#### Docks

We have been working on cleaning up Outlaws Ravine to accommodate for more dock spaces which we hope to have available later this summer. A work B was held last summer with a lot of trees and branches piled up that will be burned as soon as possible.

As a reminder boat docks and lifts need to be in the water no later than June 30 to ensure our shorelines and front yards are maintained over the summer months. There are still a considerable amount of docks & lifts that have no identification on them so it would be greatly appreciated if everyone could identify what they have on the shoreline with their name & address. This saves time for both Fred & I if we need to contact the owner.



If you are new to the village or wish to apply for dock space please contact the village office where you can get an application form.

#### **Shields Seasonal Storage Site**

To those that have a storage lot assigned to them, please ensure your space is kept up by mowing the grass and kept free of litter. Please be mindful so you are not crowding out your neighbor by going over your allotted space and interfering with their property. If you see a need to take down or remove any trees in this area please let Fred or myself know beforehand for approval. Thank you for your cooperation.

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# Operations, Maintenance and Other Information:

#### Maintenance

Thanks to our maintenance staff Fred and Glenn for the excellent job of the roads this winter. Great job guys!

For your information, failing to stop at a stop sign results in a fine that starts at \$230.00 in addition to four demerit points. Speed fines start at \$170.00 with two demerit points.

When operating a Quad or side by side you need to have a helmet on, the RCMP also recommend gloves and safety glasses.

The Dundurn Fire Department, along with the Saskatoon Fire Department recommend you check your smoke/carbon monoxide detectors, replace the batteries if equipped at least once a year. Life expectancy of these units is 10 years, then they should be replaced. Please also remember that numbers on your houses should be visible from the street in case of an emergency. Welcome to spring, we all hope.
