The Shield's financial audit is complete and posted on our Website. The village had another successful year with lot sales and lower than budgeted costs in some areas, the village once again recognized a surplus over budgeted amounts. Taxes for 2025 went up only a minimal amount which was made possible through the growth within the village creating an increase to the tax base.

There has been a tremendous amount of house construction within the village this past year and according to permits will continue on for the remainder of the year. There have been many homes renovated as well as many new homes being built in the older part of Shields, the South Mawson and SunTerra Subdivisions.

Welcome to all the newcomers that have moved into our community. If you have any questions, please contact me, council or our administration and we will be more than happy to assist you. If you are interested in getting involved in volunteering for the village, contact the office and they will give you more information.

Speaking of volunteers, as a recognition of volunteers who contribute to the community, please nominate your favourite Shields volunteer for the Spirit of Shields Award. The application and requirements are available at www.shields.ca. The volunteer that is chosen will be recognized at a Volunteer Appreciation Event.

The sewer project is in full swing. Over 70% of the residents have signed up so far. There is still time for you to sign up for the new low pressure sewer system. It is expected that the main lines will be completed by the end of August, and on-lot services will start after that date. Please make sure that you stay up to date with the project through the communications that are being sent out on a regular basis. Please abide by the street closures and parking requirements. Thanks for your patience as the project continues over the coming months.

Thank you to everyone for the warm welcome back to work this Spring. I appreciated the patience as issues were fixed, and some items were caught up on. Summers is in full swing here in Shields, so I encourage you to stop by the office to say hi if you are out golfing or walking through the village.

There are a few important notices for residents to be aware of:

- We are no longer sending mailed out copies of receipts for utility or tax bills. If you would like a receipt, you can request that one be sent via email or stop by the office, and I will provide you a printed copy.

 Additionally we have been having some IT issues and those who normally receive emailed receipts may have missed receiving them. If you are missing any receipts, please contact me at the office and I will get you another copy as soon as possible.
- The open office hours are Mondays from 12-3pm, and Wednesdays from 9am-12pm, or by appointment. I am in the office from 8:15-3:45 daily, but please try to use my office hours if possible.
- People often have projects that take place throughout the summer, please remember that any project on
 your property that will change the landscaping, or grade requires a development permit. Please also
 remember that every building permit requires an accompanying development permit. Building permits will
 not be processed until the accompanying development permit application is received.
- Payments Thank you to everyone who took advantage of the early payment discount and paid taxes in June and July. Taxes are due as of July 31st, and 1% interest is added each month the remain unpaid. Utility bills are due the end of the month they are issued, and a 2% interest charge is added each month they remain unpaid. Payments for any village items can be made by cash or cheque dropped off at the office, or through sending e-transfer to admin@shields.ca. Please remember to put a memo line about what bill you are paying and include the service address.

Low Pressure Sewer System Project Update

The sewer project is well underway. Sign up so far is going well with over 70% subscription rate and more enquiries coming in. Sign-up deadline is August 7^{th} , 2025 so get your application filled out and into the office before this date.

If you have any questions regarding the project, call Administration. Try not to interrupt the contractors as they are on a tight timeline.

Within the next couple weeks, the Project Team will have the names of Electrical Companies that residents may be interested in using if electrical upgrades are required. The project team has gone over the requirements with these companies and are awaiting a response.

The mainlines will continue to be installed over the next 5 weeks and on service work will begin in Late August. The Project Committee will continue to keep you updated on the status of the Project.


