

## PROJECT INFORMATION SHEET

### PROJECT DESCRIPTION

CONSTRUCTION OF A SHORT SPAN BRIDGE on Highway No. 211 over the Blackstrap Causeway, and for the CONSTRUCTION OF A GRADE RAISE AND SURFACING STRUCTURE; for a TOTAL DISTANCE OF 0.37 km.

### PROJECT DETAILS

- The contractor for this project is Allan Construction.
- Contract supervision will be provided by Associated Engineering (Sask.) Ltd. personnel.
- The contractor will commence work on January 20, 2020. The project has three phase as defined:
  - **Phase I** will be defined as all Work other than the Sub-base Course In Place, Granular Base Course In Place, Asphalt Concrete In Place, Reclaimed Asphalt Concrete, Traffic Gravel Behind Construction Including Hauling and Site Restoration. Completion date of **Phase I is March 31, 2020.**
  - **Phase II** will be defined as Sub-Base Course In Place, Reclaimed Asphalt Concrete, Traffic Gravel Behind Construction Including Hauling. Completion date of **Phase II is April 30, 2020.**
  - **Phase III** will be defined as Granular Base Course In Place, Asphalt Concrete In Place and Site Restoration. Completion date of **Phase III is June 15, 2020**
- For Phase I construction; the contractor will close the section of Highway No. 211 between its junction with Highway No. 11 near Dundurn, SK and the Blackstrap Provincial Park, with physical barriers to protect the worksite.
- Traffic will be detoured on the of Rural Municipality of Dundurn around the project site. The detour will be signed accordingly.
- Traffic flow through the detour will be disrupted with traffic required to reduce speeds to posted municipal speed limits or less. Public traffic can expect minor delays and disruptions to their normal travel schedules. The detour is a graveled surface and will be maintained by the Contractor to accommodate traffic.
- During Phase II and III of the project, legal width traffic shall be accommodated through the work zone as one-way traffic on temporary surface, controlled using traffic lights and appropriate traffic signage as per Ministry's standards.

- No construction activity will be at the project site from May 16, 2020 – May 19, 2020. The work site shall be open for two-way traffic during May long weekend on temporary surface.
- The estimated cost of this project is \$5.0 million, including ministry-supplied materials and construction engineering.
